Twenty tourists from the state of Michigan perished when the Ethan Allen tour boat capsized on Lake George. The Bronze Anchor was used in conjunction with the epitaph and as a symbol of hope after such a tragedy. The bronze apple blossom represents the State flower of Michigan. The contrasting steel and stippled-blued finishes denote the calm and rough waters of life.
